

War one was the Treaty of London in which Britain agreed to protect Belgium's neutrality, this affected when Germany took Belgium and went through her to get to France, so Great Britain declared war on Germany. This was signed in 1839 almost 100 years before the World War one. The next alliance was the Dual Alliance Treaty signed in 1879 between Germany and Austria-Hungary in order to protect each other if Russia attacked, later on Austria-Hungary is attacked by Russia so Germany helps Austria-Hungary. The next alliance was called the Franco-Russian Military Convention signed in 1892 between France and Russia with the purpose of giving each other military assistance if one is attacked. After these the Triple Entente was created between 1904 and 1907 with Russia, UK and France. And the Triple Alliance was made of Germany, Austria-Hungary and France although she changed sides. There is a cause that created a lot of tension that was the Franco (France) - Prussian (a big state before Germany was unified) war, that ended in 1870 and Prussia won Alsace-Lorraine, a very powerful industrial city, and in 1871 Germany was unified.

In conclusion before Franz Ferdinand was murdered there was already a lot of tension in Europe, this was the cause that gave Austria-Hungary a reason to declare Serbia war. This was the last straw that broke the camel's back.
